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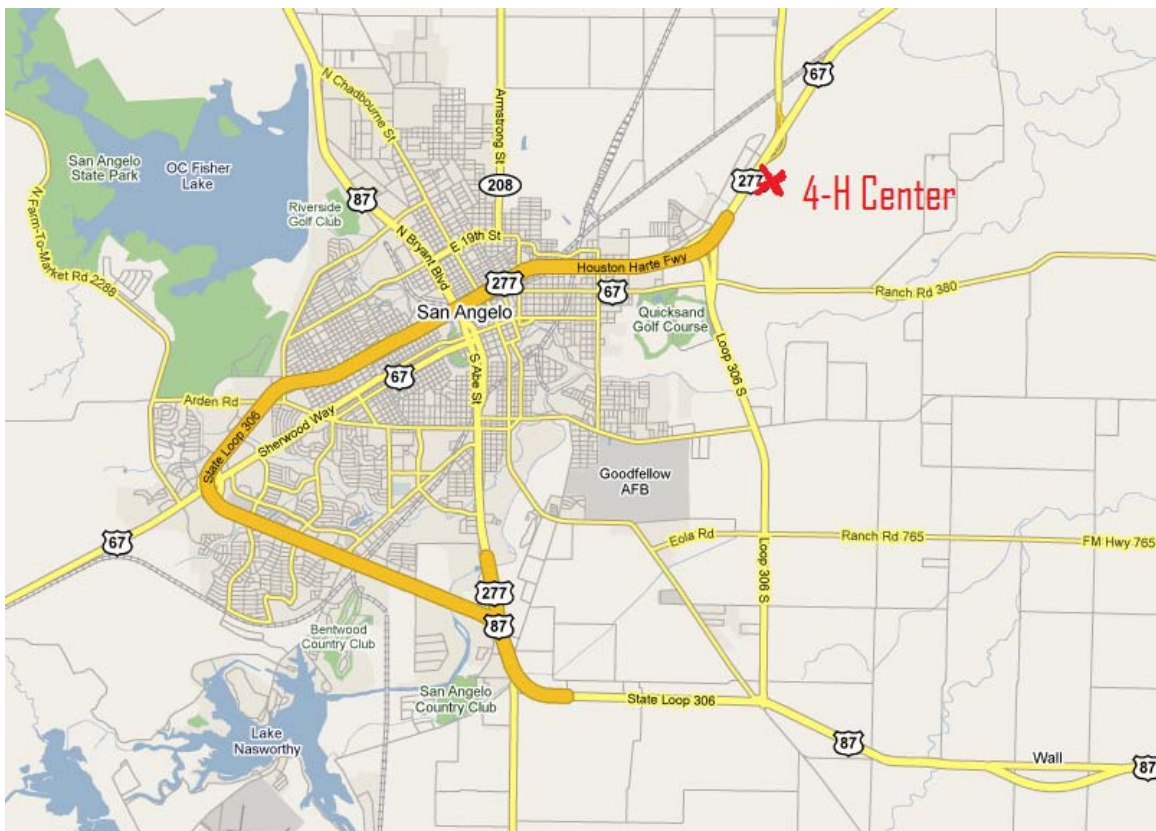


Location and Additional Info

For the history buffs

Fort Concho National Historic Landmark located at 630 S. Oakes has a number of reconstructed buildings and will allow you to visualize San Angelo as a frontier village. Historic Orient-Santa Fe Depot and Railway Museum of San Angelo shows the history of the railroad in San Angelo. It also has a model train layout depicting San Angelo in 1928. Miss Hattie's Bordello will enable you to see a different side of history of San Angelo. You can check out the website at www.misshatties.com. Miss Hattie's Restaurant serves burgers that rated number 28 in the recent *Texas Magazine* ranking.

For the individuals interested in the arts

San Angelo has a plethora of outdoor art installations. Information may be picked at the Visitors Center or sought out on the website, gosanangelo.com.

San Angelo Museum of Fine Arts often has special exhibits in addition to the permanent holdings. It is located near Fort Concho at 1 Love Street.

A number of art galleries are located in the downtown area including the Coop Gallery, J. Walker Gallery, Kendall Art Gallery, and the Tom Green Library Art Gallery.

The Old Chicken Farm at 2505 Martin Luther King Drive has an eclectic group of galleries and artists' studios. Next door is the Gecko Gallery.

For the nature lovers

The San Angelo Nature Center is located south of town at 7409 Knickerbocker Rd. The Nature Center has a museum, live animals and an interpretive garden. The Nature Center is adjacent to Lake Nasworthy, one of the several lakes around San Angelo.

San Angelo State Park is located on the west side of town. The State Park has hiking trails, campsites, a herd of bison, and a decimated prairie dog population.

Young children may enjoy the Nature Center and the State Park or they may enjoy playgrounds. Kids Kingdom located in the 300 block of River Drive is accessible. Another nice park located closer to the 4-H Building is Kirby Community Park on N. River Drive and W. 14th Street.

For the shoppers, San Angelo has a variety of shops including gifts, wine and antiques on in historic San Angelo at the corner of Concho and Chadbourne.

For the golfers, San Angelo has three public golf courses.

Santa Fe Golf Course (Santa Fe Park off Beauregard Avenue is described as a course friendly to beginners and just an enjoyable course to play.

Riverside Golf Course at 900 W. 29th Street is also available.

Quicksand Golf Course (2305 Pulliam St.) was at one time considered the ninth-toughest course in Texas. It has one of the highest slope ratings in the state for those of you who know what that means. Tee times should be set up in advance.

Restaurants in San Angelo may be limited in ethnic variety but excellent eating is to be had.

Miss Hattie's downtown has highly rated burgers.

RJ's Barbeque often ranks high in state rankings.

Locally owned steak places include Twin Mountain or, if you are to a drive, Lowake Steakhouse.
